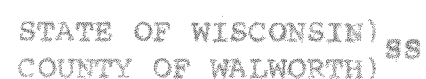

I, George T. Dunham, Surveyor, certify that I have surveyed the property as follows:

A parcel of land located in the Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 22, T 2 N, R 16 E, Walworth County, Wisconsin, described as follows: Commencing at the southeast corner of said Section 22; thence North along the east line of said Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$, 1896.3 feet; thence N87°W 543 feet to a point in the centerline of South Shore Drive; thence southwesterly along said centerline 121.54 (also described as 120.7) feet to the place of beginning; (said point of beginning being also described as the southeast corner of that certain parcel of land deeded to Horatio S. Meredith by George B. Mereness and Anna C. Mereness, his wife, on December 4, 1920, by deed recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds in and for said Walworth County, in Volume 161 of Deeds on Page 460) thence N87°00'W 472.73 feet more or less to the shore of Delavan Lake; thence southwesterly along the shore of Delavan Lake to a point where a line drawn parallel with and 100 feet from (measured at right angles to) said previously mentioned line would intersect said shore of Delavan Lake; thence S87°00'E 480.00 feet more or less to the centerline of South Shore Drive; thence N37°38'12"E along said centerline 121.54 feet to the place of beginning, subject to easements of record.
