

PARCEL 1: A part of Lots 30 and 31, Unit No. 1 Country Club Estates, located in the Village of Fontana-on-Geneva Lake, Walworth County, Wisconsin, described as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of said Lot 30; thence southerly along the east line of said Lot 30, 40.00 feet to the place of beginning; thence continue southerly along the east line of said Lots 30 and 31, 80.00 feet to the southeast corner of said Lot 31; thence northwesterly 98,93 feet to an iron pipe located 50.00 feet westerly of the place of beginning; thence easterly 50.00 feet to the place of beginning.

PARCEL 2: A part of Lot 30, Unit No. 1 Country Club Estates located in the Village of Fontana-on-Geneva Lake, Walworth County, Wisconsin, described as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of said Lot 30; thence southerly along the east line of said Lot 30, 40.00 feet; thence westerly along a line running to a point located 31.32 feet north of the southwest corner of said Lot 30, 95.39 feet to the place of beginning; thence continue on the same line 90.00 feet to a point located 31.32 feet north of the southwest corner of said Lot 30; thence northerly on a line towards the northwest corner of said Lot 30, 50.00 feet; thence southeasterly 106.02 feet to the place of beginning, together with all the land lying westerly of the west line of the above described property and the easterly curved line of Shabbona Drive.
