Dear Sir; As per your request we examined conditions at the West line and East line of the property formerly owned by Mr. H. H. Porter in this city and find as follows;

The West line, which is the boundary line between the said Porter property and the Lake Geneva Manor a subdivision formerly owned by L. Z. Leiter this line was carefully surveyed in 1926 when this Manor subdivision was proposed and found to be correct and as laid when Mr. Porter first owned the ~~line~~ land. It runs S. 22 deg. 27 min. E. 713.2 feet from an iron stake at the south line of Main St. this city; thence S. 34 deg. 27 min. 177.7 ft. to an iron stake at the shore of Geneva Lake. It is and has been by a substantial wire fence with tall turned cedar posts set in Conc. painted green with white tops which has been there for years

The East line is 182.4 feet west of the East line of Block 22, original plat of Geneva Village. This too is marked by a tight tall board fence.

I have been surveying in this vicinity about twenty five years and was City Engineer for twenty years & I planned and supervised the construction of all city improvements in the Manor and also much work for Mr. Porter and I am not aware of any question ever having been raised about any lines around the two properties, the Manor and Mr. Porters and believe every line to be correctly located and as they now stand.
