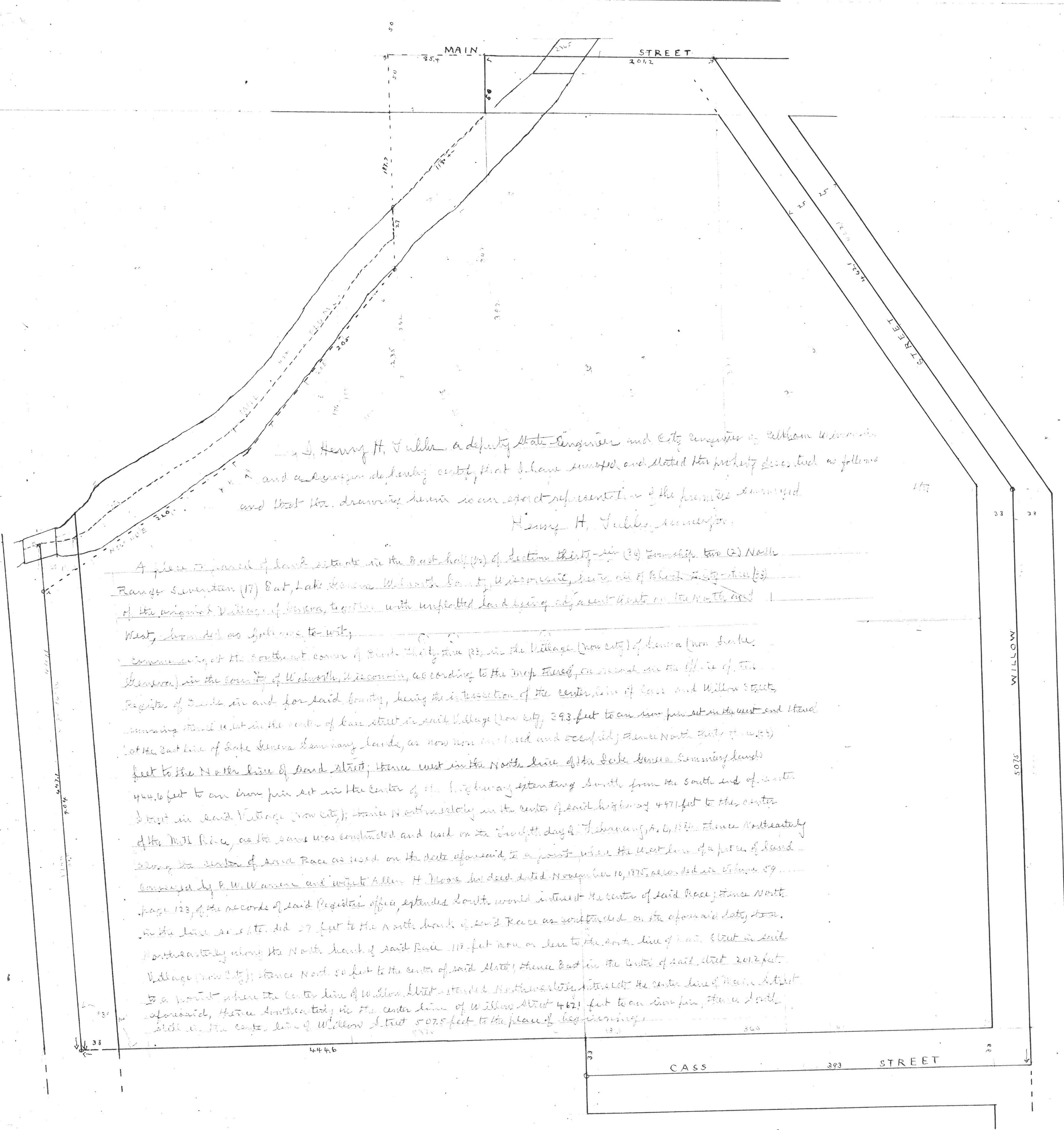




I, Henry H. Fuller, a deputy State Engineer and City Engineer of Albion, Wisconsin, and a duly sworn and duly certified, do hereby certify that I have surveyed and plotted the property described as follows and that the drawing herein is an exact representation of the premises surveyed.

A piece of land of said estate in the East half (1/2) of Section Thirty-two (32) Township Two (2) North Range Seventeen (17) East, Lake County, Wisconsin, being all of the original Village of Geneva, together with unplotted land of adjacent West, bounded as follows, to wit:
Commencing at the southwest corner of Block Thirty-two (32) in the Village (now City) of Geneva (now County of Washburn, Wisconsin, according to the map thereof, as shown in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for said County, being the intersection of the center line of Cass and Willow Streets running North and South in the center of said Village (now City) 393 feet to an iron pin set in the ground at the East line of said Geneva Township lands, as now now owned and occupied by the North State of Wisconsin; thence West in the North line of the Lake Geneva Surveying Lands 444.6 feet to an iron pin set in the center of the line here and extending South from the South end of a lot in said Village (now City); thence North in the center of said highway 447.1 feet to the center of the Mill Race, as the same was constructed and used on the 14th day of February, A. D. 1875, thence Northeast along the center of said Race as used on the date aforesaid to a point where the West line of a piece of land surveyed by R. W. W. and wife to Henry H. Moore her deed dated November 18, 1875, also shown on page 123 of the records of said Register's office, extends Southward to the center of said Race; thence North to the line as aforesaid 57 feet to the North bank of said Race as described on the aforesaid plat; thence Northeast along the North bank of said Race 117 feet more or less to the North line of said lot in said Village (now City); thence North 50 feet to the center of said street; thence East in the center of said street 201.2 feet to a point where the center line of Willow Street extended Northwardly intersects the center line of Main Street aforesaid, thence Southwardly in the center line of Willow Street 467.1 feet to an iron pin set in the ground at the center line of Willow Street 507.5 feet to the place of beginning.
